

Boomer Esiason led the Cincinnati Bengals to the Super Bowl and was the NFL's most valuable player in 1988. After four years with the New York Jets and Arizona Cardinals, Esiason, 36, returned to Cincinnati last season as a backup quarterback. This fall, Esiason makes another return to football—this time as a commentator on "Monday Night Football."

But always first with Esiason has been his son, Gunnar, who has cystic fibrosis, a disease that affects about 30,000 Americans.

Here, he writes a Father's Day tribute to his son.

Dear Gunnar,

The two greatest days of my life are the ones on which you and Sydney were born. It's really difficult to express in words the love I have for you two.

For the short seven years that you have been around, we have experienced so much together. On the day you were born—April 6, 1991—I couldn't believe my great fortune. We had a beautiful baby boy!

Since that day, you have been a sweet, gentle little soul, never complaining. In addition to looking like your mom, you have her kindness and caring personality, which makes you very, very special.

Not only are you a joy and a treasure, you are also the bravest little boy that I know.
